MARINELAND



Marineland opened in 1938 as the world's first underwater motion picture studio. A new word, "oceanarium," was coined to describe it - denoting a place where various species of marine life lived together, as they do in the sea, rather than kept segregated, as they had traditionally been in aquaria. Today you can swim and paint with the dolphins.

You can visit the museum's exciting exhibit include a Marine Studios fish basket, a Zeiss Ikon Moviscop movie film editor and viewer, posters, photographs, and round brass helmet.

RIGHT WHALE UPDATE

It is estimated there are fewer than 350 North Atlantic right whales remaining. With so few of these whales left, researchers closely monitor the southeastern United States for new offspring during the annual right whale calving season.

So far, researchers have identified 11 live calves this calving season.
