## FLAGLER BEACH PIER

### WHAT DOES THE FUTURE LOOK LIKE



Construction of the new proposed pier is expected to begin in the summer of 2024 and will take a few years to complete. As proposed, the new pier will be 828 feet long, its historic length. The first 82.5 feet of the existing wooden pier will be repaired and retained connecting to the new construction that is 715 feet long by 25 feet wide. The new pier will have a 20-foot-long T-head which would be 32 feet wide. The new pier will be 28 feet above the water while the existing pier is

17.8 feet above the water.

The new pier will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act to include a 5% slope from the old deck to the new deck and handrails. It will feature a firewater system, fish-cleaning stations, trash receptacles, benches, shade structures, observation areas, and turtle-friendly lighting.

During construction, they will have sea animal watch stations to ensure construction doesn't harm any sea animals.
